NEW BRUNSWICK EDUCATION FOUNDATION THIRD ANNUAL AWARDS GALA HONORS ALUMNI AND STUDENTS

Additionally, the NBEF awarded 12 scholarships to graduating seniors. More than 260 people attended the NBEF Gala Awards Dinner at The Imperia in Somerset.

The eight New Brunswick High School graduates inducted into the Hall of Distinguished Alumni were:

Dr. Keith Blackman, Class of 1975, graduated from Case Western Reserve University School of Medicine and has gone on to a distinguished medical career in public health and tropical medicine.

Raul Carballido, Class of 1978, is a career FBI agent where he specializes in drug issues and counter terrorism activities.

Hon. Barnett Hoffman (Retired), Class of 1958, served as a judge on the Middlesex County District Court, the Superior Court Bench and was the Presiding Criminal Judge in Middlesex County, at the time of his retirement.

Roger Locandro, Ph.D., Class of 1954, is a retired member of the faculty of the Rutgers University School of Biological and Environmental Sciences and the New Jersey Agricultural Station.

Dianne (Torres) Roman, Class of 1988, is the former Business Administrator for the City of Perth Amboy and is the current Director of the Office on Aging for Perth Amboy.

Crystal Anderson Singleton, Class of 1963, is the owner and manager of the Anderson Funeral Service in New Brunswick and Trenton.
